# **President's Report**

It is my pleasure to present the Auckland City Athletics (ACA) Club 2024.25 Season President's Report

#### Membership

The 2024.25 season was another fantastic year for the club with 15 JuniorX Members; 78 Central Hub Members; and 175 Full Members = Total 268 Members which continues the membership growth trend over the last 5 years. Please see Karen's membership report for more details on Full Members.

#### **Financials**

The club is in robust financial health. Our total equity increased from \$96K to \$118K over the year which includes bank reserves of \$106K. Please see Michelle's Treasurer's report for details.

#### Coaching

The Central Hub coaching initiative for School Years 7-10 had a new record of 78 athletes for the year with an average of 28 registrations per term. This generates over \$16,000 revenue for the club. Big thanks to our partners Ellerslie, Roskill South, Pt Chevalier, Hillsborough and Eastern Junior clubs; and super coaches Ignacio Pena Araya & Bailey Stewart.

We also continued the <u>The Junior X Run Club</u> for School Years 5-8 in Cornwall Park with a total of 15 athletes over terms 2 and 3. We have an exciting plan in place to increase participation for the 2025.26 season.

A big thanks to all our ACA Athlete <u>Coaches</u> for the great work you do with our members

#### Communication

Thanks to Karen Rickerby for our weekly club newsletter.

We continue to see good growth in the reach of our bi-monthly <u>ACA in Action</u> with our total subscription increasing to over 850 folks with an average 600 opens and 70 clicks.

Also we had growth our <u>ACA website</u> sessions to 13,437 (22% up on last season) and 6241 unique users (20% increase), in particular showing the positive impact of the ACA Race Nights

Our <u>Instagram</u> reach has grown to an average of 1000+ views per post; while our <u>Facebook</u> followers increased by over 10% to 967

#### **Events**

We ran the ACA Southland Relays (470 entries) and the ACA Pairs (204 entries) interclub races during the cross-country season. We had another very successful year as a club at National Road Relays (NRR) with one Gold (Junior Women) and a Bronze (Veteran Men) from the six teams we sent to Taupo. We have plans in place to make all these events bigger and better next season.

Over the summer track and field season we successfully hosted 4 x ACA Race Nights and an ACA Mile Night at Mt Smart Track with 493 entries, 3 NZ Records, lots of PBs and \$5030 revenue for the club.

Some JuniorX club subscriptions may be journalled as Central Hub from Stripe as the same value.



# **Special Events Report**

#### **National Road Relays 2024**

- New Zealand Road Relays were held in Taupo in on 28 September 2024
- The ACA team stayed at the Millennium Manuels in Taupo and the race was held on the closed-loop circuit at Taupo Motorsport Park/
- ACA entered six teams (two Junior Women, one Junior Men, one Senior Men, one Master Men 35+ and one Master Men 60+)
- Two medals Junior Women A (1st) and Master Men 60+ (3rd)
- Applications were submitted to three charitable trusts, and we received grant funding from NZCT and Four Winds Foundation to the value of \$15,000.00
- Athletes paid \$200 each.

## Fast and Furious Nights 2024/25 Season

- ACA held five special Fast and Furious Nights under Lights in the 2024/25 season four of the meets followed the standard program (100/200/400/800/1500/3000) and one was Mile Night where Sam Ruthe was the youngest to run a sub-4-minute mile.
- We implemented and used the Roster Athletics system to handle all entries, payments and seeding of races, which proved to be a huge improvement on the manual system we used the previous season.
- The total number of entries across the nights was:
  - Race Night 1 90 entries (\$820)
  - Race Night 2 138 entries (\$1180)
  - o Race Night 3 109 entries (\$1060)
  - Race Night 4 124 entries (\$1310)
  - Mile Night 32 entries (\$660)
- \$1000 NZ Record payments were made to Sam Ruthe (x2) and Sarah Hellyer
- ACA athletes were free and non-ACA athletes paid \$10 for sprints and \$20 for distance races

### WINTER SEASON REPORT

Another busy and success filled Winter season for ACA athletes. Performance highlights and event reviews outlined below.

## Southland Centennial – 13th April

Race 1 - 250 athletics from 68 teams

Race 2 - 220 athletics from 55 teams

Total = 470 which is slightly up from 2023.

Was the second club event of the Senior Winter League this year (after Auckland Waterfront Half) and was well supported by most clubs. Weather mostly held off although it became quite windy and we need to have a higher and more sturdy mounting for the clocks (we ended up only using one). A suggestion was also made to locate timekeepers on the infield.

We went for just two races this year to compress the program. This helped with bigger numbers on the start line which helped the vibe of the race. Did not seem to cause any problems with lap keeping.

Resources were s bit stretched again and we ended up getting a little pressed on time before the first race. Trickier without the new AAI gear trailer as well. Debacle with the portaloo's getting dropped off in the wrong place but we got a refund and the college's facilities manager came and opened up the gym toilets for us.

#### **ACA Pairs relays**

Another year well received by the junior clubs. This year consisted of:

- 26 Senior Teams all grades (2 athletes per team)
- 16 Junior Girls teams (4 athletes per team)
- 22 Junior Boys teams (4 athletes per team)

As with last year we did not have many ACA teams, 3 total. Compare that with Oratia and Lynndale who had 12 and 26 teams respectively. Definitely seen as a junior race which is why it is on the Junior Winter League this year but not the Senior Winter League. Brought forward a week in the calendar in 2024, just before NZXC

#### Club days

We held King of the Mountain this season. Was a beautiful clear day to run up the maunga although we only had 5 athletes race.

Did not hold any other club days (Cream Bun, Ian Hay/Bull & Cow etc)

## **TRACK & FIELD Report**

ACA ran 17 Wednesday Club Nights over the course of the season, plus four extremely successful ACA Race Night Events, well-attended by ACA athletes and athletes from other Auckland Clubs and further afield. Attendance at the regular Club Nights had its usual ups and downs, but our numbers were again boosted by the schools bringing their athletes along and visiting athletes keen to take advantage of the electronic timing we operate on the track at Mt Smart on Wednesday evenings.

In the 2024-25 Athletics Auckland Track and Field inter-club competition, the **McKinnon Shield**, ACA athletes performed well over the season turning up and scoring points for the Club. As a result **ACA Club finished 4th in the Premier Division** with 7,518 points after the 9 rounds of competition. The stand-out points-scorer for ACA in the McKinnon Shield (ranked 6<sup>th</sup> on the list of top-scoring athletes) was Zach Nannestad. Zara Bint was the highest scoring female athlete for ACA.

ACA Club athletes also put on a strong showing at the **2025 Auckland Championships** with Club 54 athletes competing. ACA athletes won a total of **18 Golds, 20 Silver and 11 Bronze medals**. Charles Howlett won golds in both the MU20 400m and Discus, and silver medals in the 200m and Shot Put. India Nash took double Gold in the WU18 100m Hurdles and WU18 300m Hurdles and was 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Long Jump. Another multiple medal-winner was Benaiah Su who won the MU18 Long Jump and was second in the Shot Put and Discus. Cole Yeager went for Gold in the MU20 100m and Silver in the 200m, while Lisa Hellyer won the WU18 800m and Sarah Hellyer won the Silver. Scott Thomson took Gold in the SM Triple Jump.

At the National Championships in March many of the same ACA athletes who had entered the Auckland Champs travelled to Dunedin, selected to represent Auckland, or competing for ACA Club. 37 participated in the NZ Championships and brought home a total of **5 Gold, 6 Silver and 4 Bronze medals**. In addition 9 ACA athletes in the Auckland Team were selected for relays resulting two further Golds, a Silver and a Bronze. ACA WU18 middle distance women did well, with Nina Chalmers winning the 1500m, Scarlett Robb first in the WU18 3000m and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 1500m, while Lisa and Sarah Hellyer again made it 1-2 in the 800m. Sam Burton and Charlotte Goldsmith brought home Golds in the MU20 High Jump and WU20 Long Jump.
